Description

The advanced-level course “Create – Protect – Innovate: Bringing ideas to market”, developed by the European Patent Office, is aimed at master’s and PhD students in science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM). It builds practical understanding of how patents are granted, enforced and used to support technology transfer, IP commercialisation and innovation strategy.

The course explores patentability requirements, patent enforcement, technology scouting, commercialisation and the practical use of IPRs through examples drawn from innovation practice.

FAQ

How do I register?

Register using your full name, surname(s), and university email address.

What happens after I register?

You should receive a confirmation email. If it does not arrive, contact academy@epo.org. Then create an EPO account on the European Patent Academy learning platform using the same email address.

Do I need to attend the masterclasses?

No. Masterclasses are **optional** live sessions that support your learning. They are **not recorded**.

What do I need to know about the exam?

The exam is open book and covers the course content. To take it, you must complete all five modules and score at least 80/100 in each end-of-module quiz. The performance in the end-of-module quiz does not influence the final grade.

Will I receive a certificate?

Yes. If you pass with at least 70/100, you will receive an EPO certificate. Download it before the course closes (usually a month after the grades are published).

Can I receive ECTS credits?

Some universities may award ECTS credits for successful completion. The EPO shares results, but each university makes the final decision.
